#### HEADLINES JANUARY 2022 FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

#### January 2022 Results

#### **REVENUE**

Actual revenue is \$109,917, which is approximately 20.6% (\$28.6k) behind our January budget. Grant Funds, Endowment Income, and Earned Income are on target. We are slightly behind our plan in Development Revenues (16.6%); however, we are continuing to receive memorial contributions in honor of Liza Townsend. Annual Event Revenue is behind our January target primarily due to the change in date of the event. The delay in the event has delayed Annual Event pledges and sponsorship commitments. Excluding organizations that provide support through their Ethics Services Agreements, Annual Event support is currently approximately \$56k.

#### **EXPENSES**

Actual expenses are \$121,668, which is favorable by approximately \$11.6k to budget. The primary favorable variance is in the Salaries, Benefits and Other Staff Costs category. The January 457(b) fund performance results in a favorable variance in that category of approximately \$10.5k.

#### **OPERATIONS THROUGH JANUARY, 2022**

Net unrestricted operating revenue over expenditures for January is (\$11,751). Combined with January other income of (\$9,526) primarily related to the Center's 457(b) plan, our total net unrestricted net income is (\$21,278). We had anticipated having net unrestricted revenue of \$5.2k for the month of January so we are approximately (\$26.5k) behind our plan at this point.
