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James Stowe Appointed New President and CEO of the Center

The Board of Directors of the Center for Practical Bioethics is proud to announce the naming of James Stowe as the third President and CEO in the organization's nearly 40-year history, succeeding John Carney who retires in January. Stowe's official first day at the Center's offices at 1111 Main Street in downtown Kansas City will be January 30, 2023.

Stowe brings a host of experience in community health, fundraising and nonprofit management to the role. "We were especially impressed by James' approach to partnership-building, operations experience and research background," said Stephen Salanski and Eva Karp, who co-chaired the nine-member search committee. Stowe's appointment concludes an extensive national search conducted by EFL Associates.

Stowe is currently the Director of Aging and Adult Services for Mid-America Regional Council (MARC), where he oversees their services to directly improve the lives of older adults by focusing on the role of social factors in health and function. He has published more than a dozen peer-reviewed articles on aging and human development. Stowe has also served two terms as Board President for the Missouri Association of Area Agencies on Aging.

He holds a Doctorate in Human Environmental Sciences from the University of Missouri-Columbia and a master's degree in Family Studies and Human Services from Kansas State University, both with an emphasis on gerontology.
