
Ann Karty and the Enduring Impact of Bioethics Case Studies

Ann Karty was a student in the University of Missouri Kansas City's innovative six-year B.A./M.D. program when Dr. Hans Uffelmann – a philosopher and one of three founders of the Center for Practical Bioethics – used case studies to teach bioethics.




Last Advance Care Planning Webinar This Year

Join our last session of the year in partnership with Kansas City Public Library to learn how you can ensure that the healthcare you want is the healthcare you get.




