

For example, a recent issue explored brain death. Determining death based on neurological criteria (i.e., brain death) is relatively new to human understandings of what it means to be dead. So it's probably no surprise that neurological criteria remain somewhat controversial even after 50 years of statutory permissibility and clinical practice.


You can meet Jeff and Naomi in person or virtually on **September 21** when they present the **29th Annual Rosemary Flanigan Lecture**.

Ethical Al Strengthening Community Partnerships a Priority for 2024

Healthcare providers have many tools to assist in making decisions but few systems monitor the information upon which these tools are built and the decisions they produce. The Center's Ethical AI Initiative is working to address this gap, reduce risk for bias, and promote equity and justice in the application

of artificial intelligence in healthcare. In 2022, the Initiative held workshops and created goals with community partners, The University of Kansas Health System and Children's Mercy, including testing of a 12-module curriculum for teaching the application of bioethics principles to AI systems and to facilitate process improvements.

This summer, the Initiative's 20-member Advisory Council met for a two-day retreat in Kansas City to review accomplishments and establish tangible goals for 2024, including strengthening community partnerships, creating a sustainable Ethical AI service model, and working with healthcare IT vendors.
