

OVERVIEW

- **ISSUE:** The ongoing need for culturally respectful care conversations between healthcare professionals and underserved populations remains a critical issue.
- **SOLUTION:** Addressing disparities in advance care planning (ACP) within African American communities through the structured LTAACP program led by trained facilitators.





The Need for Advance Care Planning in African American Communities

- **STATISTIC:** African Americans are less likely to engage in ACP compared to their White counterparts. https://pmc.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/articles/PMC9998020/
- IMPLICATION: This disparity may lead to end-of-life care that does not align with patient preferences.






Evidence Supporting Structured ACP Programs

Community-based ACP events designed and led by and for the Black community are highly acceptable...

To broaden the reach of ACP to promote equity and to empower communities to leverage their priorities and assets for sustainable ACP engagement, there is a need for a fully community-based approach to ACP, and specifically, approaches that are initiated, designed, implemented, and tested by the Black community.

Addressing Disparities through Organized Curricula with Certified Facilitators

APPROACH: Implementing the structured LTAACP program with certified facilitators to ensure culturally sensitive and effective communication within our **targeted population**.





Benefits of Certified Facilitators in ACP

ADVANTAGE: Trained facilitators can navigate cultural nuances, building trust and understanding within African American communities.





Facilitator-Suggested Outreach Strategies

- Group Training Sessions: Conduct sessions with multiple churches simultaneously.
- Virtual Information Sessions: Use platforms like Zoom to introduce the program to various congregations.
- Social Media Campaigns: Create targeted campaigns to raise awareness among faith-based organizations.





Challenges in Advancing the ACP Initiative in the African American Community

- Community Skepticism: Building trust within communities with historical mistrust of healthcare systems.
- Resource Limitations: Training programs often have associated costs.
 - *Example:* Vital Talk courses range from \$300-\$1,000.





Addressing Financial Challenges

- Alternative Funding: Seek grants focused on health equity and community education.
- Sliding Scale Fees: Implement payment models based on participants' ability to pay. (Determine best approach)
- Volunteer Facilitators: Engage community members willing to be trained and serve pro bono.
- Aligned Sponsorships: Seek corporate and foundation sponsors whose mission aligns with LTAACP.
- Community Partnerships: Collaborate with organizations and faith-based groups who reach our target audience.





What We've Done So Far for the Educational LTAACP Program

- 1.Community Assessment: Identify specific needs and preferences within the target community.
- **2.Curriculum Development:** Create culturally relevant materials addressing identified needs.
- **3.Facilitator Training:** Certify facilitators with emphasis on cultural competence.
- **4.Event Implementation:** Host workshops in accessible community venues.
- 5.Feedback Mechanism: Collect participant feedback to refine future sessions.






Service Goals for the LTAACP Program

- 1.Certified Facilitator Training: Equip individuals with skills to lead ACP discussions.
 - *Objective:*Train 40 facilitators within the first year.
 - *Milestone:* Achieve a 100% certification rate among trainees.
- 2.LTAACP Workshops (Virtual and In-Person): Educate the community on the importance of ACP.
 - *Objective:* Facilitators to conduct 2 workshops each annually, 80+ workshops collectively.
 - *Milestone:* Reach 500 community members each year collectively.
- 3.Information Sessions for Faith Leaders: Engage religious leaders to advocate for ACP.
 - *Objective:*Host bi-monthly information sessions with at least 15-20 faith leaders.
 - Milestone: Integrate LTAACP workshops into 20 congregations within a year.





Advancement Strategy for Promoting and Marketing the LTAACP Program

• STRATEGIES:

- **Community Partnerships:** Collaborate with organizations and faith-based groups who reach our target audience.
- Social Media Outreach: Utilize platforms and content types popular within the African American community to share information.
- **Testimonials:** Share success stories from program participants on website and social media.
- Local Media: Engage with community radio stations, influencers and news stations.
- Hosting LTAACP Workshops: Focus on states where we have Certified Facilitators.
- **Aligned Sponsorships:** Seek strategic corporate and foundation sponsors whose mission aligns with LTAACP (for funding and in-kind support).




