


Gathering Feedback

Define fees for participation in the Ethical AI Recognition Program and work with partners to test receptivity and relationship to other service offerings. Add \$50,000 in new revenue through ethics services agreements. Maintain a substantial press to engage prospect partners (e.g., grants, collaborator organizations, and entities to purchase services), by meeting with at least one new prospect every month.
